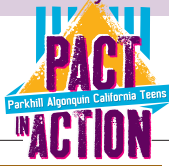


2016-2019 } Parkhill, Algonquin and California Teens (PACT) IN ACTION: LOGIC MODEL } *Teens Mobilizing to Eliminate Dating Violence*

ULTIMATE VISION: The PACT in Action program will increase capacity to prevent domestic violence by empowering youth, community members and service providers in PAC neighborhoods to address related risk factors and increase protective factors.

NEEDS

What needs does the program address?

Parkhill, Algonquin and California (PAC) Neighborhoods

Each exhibits several risk factors for perpetration or victimization of teen dating violence, including: high rates of unemployment, low educational attainment, and average annual family income below poverty level.

Teen Residents of PAC Neighborhoods

- High rates of youth arrest for violent crimes, including forcible rape
- Data show that students from PAC rank among the lowest in access to supportive adults, feelings of safety, and positive relationships with others.

GOALS

What does the program hope to achieve?

Equip youth with the knowledge and skills necessary to support and lead efforts to reduce teen dating violence in the 40210 area.

Increase the engagement and accessibility of caring adults toward a reduction in teen dating violence.

Enhance youth and adult community members' knowledge, skills and engagement to reduce risk factors and increase protective factors in the built environment which would support a reduction in teen dating violence.

OBJECTIVES & ACTIONS

What goes on in the program?

- Objective 1: Align youth violence prevention efforts**
 - PACT will host a collaborative gathering of youth initiatives.
 - PACT will work with partner organizations to create a Youth Training Institute
 - YAB, One Love Louisville and Youth Violence Prevention Resource Center members will share knowledge and skills
 - PACT will convene a monthly roundtable of community groups to address youth violence prevention, support Chapter sites and educate providers

- Objective 2: Support the enforcement and utilization of Interpersonal Protective Orders**
 - YAB members will implement a peer advocacy program to support teens filing IPO's
 - YAB members will provide information on IPO's to local parents, organizations and systems serving teens
 - YAB members will advocate for policy change within a system impacted by the enforcement of IPO's

- Objective 3: Support and expand positive changes contributing to safety in the built environment.**
 - YAB will advocate for the creation of a neighborhood association in an underrepresented area of 40210
 - YAB will educate Habitat for Humanity staff and volunteers
 - YAB will advocate for policy change contributing to the safety of the built environment of 40210

- Objective 4: Increase the community's capacity to support prevention efforts.**
 - PACT Chapter sites will educate 40210 youth
 - PACT will disseminate teen dating violence prevention messaging to KyOne Health employees
 - PACT Chapter sites will implement the annual #PreventIt public awareness campaign
 - PACT will offer Green Dot bystander intervention training to the 40210 business and faith community
 - PACT will support Green Dot-trained businesses to incorporate violence prevention practices

- Objective 5: Design and implement multigenerational efforts to prevent intimate partner/dating violence.**
 - YAB will facilitate biannual family dinner night conversations focused on violence prevention
 - YAB will engage men in the 40210 in biannual "RealTalk" conversations
 - Male community members in 40210 will be encouraged to take part in Green Dot training
 - An Adult and Alumni Advisory Board will be organized to engage adult 40210 residents in PACT messaging and activities
 - YAB will facilitate after-school programming with middle school students in 40210

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

How can we objectively measure each strategy?

SHORT-TERM (1-3 Years)

- Prevention programming will be expanded into other areas of the city via PACT 'chapters.'
- PACT leaders and YAB members will have collaborated with multiple organizations to share & absorb knowledge & skills.
- Community groups, service providers, partnering organizations & Chapter sites will have increased their knowledge and capacity to address teen dating violence.
- Teens, parents, organizations & systems will have increased support and knowledge related to the filing of IPO's.
- YAB members will have advocated for policy change related to the enforcement of IPO's and safety in the built environment of 40210.
- Teens from the 40210 area will have enhanced knowledge, skills & efficacy in youth violence prevention.

INTERMEDIATE (3-5 Years)

- A neighborhood association in an underrepresented area of 40210 will be established.
- Organizations participating in the Green Dot bystander intervention training will incorporate violence prevention strategies into their programs.
- The PACT Adult and Alumni Advisory Board will continue engage 40210 residents in PACT messaging and activities.

LONG TERM (5+ Years)

The PACT in Action program will achieve a measurable reduction in the incidence of domestic violence in the 40210 zip code by the year 2020.
